WHY SHOULD SOMEONE WATCH US PERFORM?



PROUDEST NEW G MOMENTS?

The first time we sang in Washington, I actually got to meet people that I had only read about in the paper. Our local representative, Tom Coleman, took us under his wing and so we got to meet people. We sang on the steps of the Capitol, and Congress wrote that up and voted on it and had entered into the Congressional Record that day. So you can look up in the Library of Congress and see New G in there.

WHAT MAKES NEW G SPECIAL?

We always involve the kids-we didn't tell them what to do. We found out what they wanted to do. I just love it from the time they come in when they're like 14 and they hang in for 5 or 6 years. They can be so helpful. The other thing I'm always impressed with is that the kids can really reach out and touch people. They really can think, take the time, and do. I think that the group in itself sometimes has really touched audiences. Our Christmas Program was that way when we sang "I have Seen The Light." it was something special, and everyone felt it.

When their talent is given the opportunity to expand, to grow, it's amazing to watch. I never really had a problem challenging the kids to grow. They'd say, "Okay show me how." I've enjoyed so much watching people grow, and seeing them come into the group, and then what they do because of it.

HOW IS THE GROUP DIFFERENT FROM THE 70S? HOW IS IT THE SAME?





YOUTH LEADERS


Within New G, there are many moving parts which require leadership from the members of these two groups.

We loved singing in the rain in this amphitheater in Pennsylvania in 2019.




2020 DE-TOUR

MOSTLY ACCURATE MAP OF MANY STOPS AND EXAMPLE ROUTES FROM 1970 - NOW



NEW GCROSS

Since 1972, a small leather cross been the symbol has of membership in New G. It is crude and simple, like the cross Christ died on. While on tour in California. years ago, a man named Henry Butcher (original letter below) gave every Singer a cross. He had carved each one by hand. He realized this was a ministry he could perform, and ended up distbuting these crosses all over the world...even behind the Iron Curtain.

Henry passed away in 2003 at the age of 91. The Christian Men's Fellowship at his church has continued making and distributing the crosses so that his ministry can continue. Mr. Butcher would always wear one of the crosses and if anyone asked about it, he would give a testimony of his faith. No count was every taken as to how many crosses Henry distributed, but a good guess is well into the thousands. In the same fashion, our crosses our a testimony to what New G represents.

OUR FRIEND SCOTT

As we look back on what has made New G special for so many, it's obvious that the connection we have to each other is very deep. If not, maybe we wouldn't still be around 50+1 years later. So today, we want to mention one of our own. One of our active volunteers, Scott Johnson, recently passed away. He had many hobbies, but more importantly, he shared his talents with others, teaching us all new things much of the time. He would always get fried chicken and a butterscotch cashew sundae at Culver's. He was a huge K-State fan; that's why this and other pages have used purple.

Like many New G Family members who have come and gone, Scott dedicated his free time to New G other community organizations. He was always doing something behind the scenes because he believed in what New G represents, but never wanted credit for his part. He had many strengths like photography, theater, web-design, lighting, getting things done, friendship, loyalty, logistics, and problem solving--things that are vital to organizations like ours. For a few years, he was able to go on tour with us, and he drove his own vehicle 3.000+ miles. staving an hour ahead of us. He would radio back and tell us where we could get in an out for lunch with 2 charter busses. Then he'd drive on and scout out the performance, telling us where to back the truck in and where to park the busses. Even right after tour ended, he was ready to discuss how to make it even better next year.
